Hunter Safety Education ~ Become an Instructor!

I recently attended the Hunter Safety Instructor Class to become a Certified Instructor!

If you're interested in becoming an Instructor, you must hold a Hunting License! If you don't have one, then the first step in becoming an Instructor is to take a Hunter Safety Class.

Once you have taken that Class, you are now eligible to become an Instructor.

If you are interested in becoming an Instructor, head to the DNR website to get more information.

It's all volunteer hours, but the program is so important for our youth.

Once you've applied to become an Instructor, there are three Modules (with exams) that you are required to take and PASS. There's a lot of information there, but support is available to anyone who becomes an Instructor. Once you have completed these modules, you will be invited to attend the Instructor Training and there are 3 available locations across the State. You will choose the date and location that is most convenient for you.

I chose Roscommon on Higgins Lake and my training was held October 11th and 12th. Class began at 8:00 am and went until 5:00 pm on day one and was 8:00 am to 4:00 pm on day 2. There were two exams on the second day, you must pass with 90%. You are welcome to go the day before. **Your meals and lodging are included**. You pay for nothing but your gas to get there and back. The facilities are quite nice and the food was great too! There's lots to walk around and see and everyone there is helpful and friendly. You will receive your Diploma, Instructor Cap and Vest (to wear while instructing a class) and you must complete the training hours (only a few per year) to keep your Certification up to date.

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Club Policies

Please remember that our Club is both "Cigarette and Vape" free.
No Exceptions.

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The "Grease Board" at the club is supposed to be used for patterning your shotguns. This is intended to be shot with either #7 $\frac{1}{2}$ or #8 shot.

If you want to pattern your shotgun with heavier shot, use the berm!

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Please Remember Our Range Rules and Policies

DO NOT post your targets on the target frame posts.

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Range Rules / Policies

- 1. Range hours by township regulation are 9:00 am to 9:00 pm. We would prefer that rifle and pistol shooting take place at little later in the morning.
- 2. Targets are to be posted at the backstop not in the middle of the field. This is to prevent possible ricochets over the backstop.
- 3. Fasten targets to the backers, and not on the uprights and crossbars of the target frame.
- 4. No fully automatic fire. Avoid rapid fire that sounds like automatic fire.
- 5. Target benches have been placed at 100 yards and at 50 yards. Please don't move them. If you absolutely have to move them, then return them to their proper places.
- 6. Do not shoot at glass targets. Remove all target debris and put it in the dumpster on your way out.
- 7. Limit the number of guests that you bring to use the range to two. In October and November limit your guest to two members of your immediate family. That time of the year sees heavy range use due to sighting in for hunting season. The range is intended for the use of club members and bringing extra people may limit member use.
- 8. On your way out, please drop \$5 (or more) in the range vault for each person using the range. The vault is located on the left side of the roadway across from the dumpster.
- 9. Lock the gate on your way IN, and on the way OUT.
- 10. Do not loan your gate key to anyone. The range is for members only. Membership card required while on the range.
- 11. Check the club calendar before coming out to the range to be sure that there isn't another event going on that would prevent you from using the rifle and pistol range.
- 12. The use of Tannerite and other explosive targets or projectiles have been BANNED from use.

Please clean up when you're done

Four Rules of Gun Safety

- All Guns Are Always Loaded
- Never Let The Muzzle Cover Something You Are Not Willing To Destroy
- Keep Your Finger Off The Trigger Until Your Sights Are On The Target
- Be Sure Of Your Target And What Is Beyond It

* please do not leave the lock hanging open on the gate, always lock it on to the gate so it can't be taken off with (this has happened in the past!).
