Hunter Safety Education ~ Become an Instructor!

If you're interested in becoming an Instructor, you must hold a Hunting License! If you don't have one, then the first step in becoming an Instructor is to take a Hunter Safety Class.

Once you have taken that Class, you are now eligible to become an Instructor.

If you are interested in becoming an Instructor, head to the DNR website to get more information.

It's all volunteer hours, but the program is so important for our youth.

Once you've applied to become an Instructor, there are three Modules (with exams) that you are required to take and PASS. There's a lot of information there, but support is available to anyone who becomes an Instructor. Once you have completed these modules, you will be invited to attend the Instructor Training and there are 3 available locations across the State. You will choose the date and location that is most convenient for you.

Class began at 8:00 am and went until 5:00 pm on day one and was 8:00 am to 4:00 pm on day 2. There were two exams on the second day, you must pass with 90%. You are welcome to go the day before. **Your meals and lodging are included.** You pay for nothing but your gas to get there and back. The facilities are quite nice, and the food was great too! There's lots to walk around and see and everyone there is helpful and friendly. You will receive your Diploma, Instructor Cap and Vest (to wear while instructing a class) and you must complete the training hours (only a few per year) to keep your Certification up to date.

To be eligible for Membership (from the website):

“Applicant must be 18 years old or older for **Regular Membership** or 10 – 17 years old for a **Junior Membership**.

All members, 18 years old and older, are required to pass a background check, provided by the State of Michigan. Cost related to background check will be borne by the Applicant. If the Applicant fails the background check, he/she will be denied membership, and will be refunded all application costs, except for background check cost. Applicants must pass a background check for any felony convictions.

Purpose of the background check is to protect the numerous youth programs conducted by the Club and/or on the Club Property. This is to protect the Club for general liabilities and insurance purposes.

The Club will not maintain the detailed information, the applicant will have to contact the Membership Chair and provide the needed information for the background check. If during the length of the yearly membership the Club discovers that a member has occurred a violation of the background criteria, he/she will be removed from the membership and will not be reimbursed any membership fees.

Junior members under 18 years old, will not be required to undergo a background check.

Applicants must present fees and application at the next board meeting to be approved for membership.

Upon approval you will be invited to the next board meeting.”

Remember to contact Jan to do the background as soon as you submit your application.

Annual Dues are payable August 1st of every year.

Gate keys (\$15) are also available from Jan.

A friendly reminder to always carry your Membership Card while at the Club. If you're not sure whether someone using the range is a member or not, please ask them for their ID and be sure to present yours if asked.

You can also ask to see their gate key and note the serial number.

Anyone refusing, take their photo as well as taking note of the license plate on their vehicle. This is an effort to stop non-members from using our facilities.

If you want to pattern your shotgun with heavier shot, use the berm!

Range Rules / Policies

1. Range hours by township regulation are 9:00 am to 9:00 pm. We would prefer that rifle and pistol shooting take place at little later in the morning.
2. Targets are to be posted at the backstop not in the middle of the field. This is to prevent possible ricochets over the backstop.
3. Fasten targets to the backers, and not on the uprights and crossbars of the target frame.
4. No fully automatic fire. Avoid rapid fire that sounds like automatic fire.
5. Target benches have been placed at 100 yards and at 50 yards. Please don't move them. If you absolutely have to move them, then return them to their proper places.
6. Do not shoot at glass targets. Remove all target debris and put it in the dumpster on your way out.
7. Limit the number of guests that you bring to use the range to two. In October and November limit your guest to two members of your immediate family. That time of the year sees heavy range use due to sighting in for hunting season. The range is intended for the use of club members and bringing extra people may limit member use.
8. On your way out, please drop \$5 (or more) in the range vault for each person using the range. The vault is located on the left side of the roadway across from the dumpster.
9. Lock the gate on your way IN, and on the way OUT.
10. Do not loan your gate key to anyone. The range is for members only. Membership card required while on the range.
11. Check the club calendar before coming out to the range to be sure that there isn't another event going on that would prevent you from using the rifle and pistol range.
12. The use of Tannerite and other explosive targets or projectiles have been BANNED from use.
